PLANET leads international consortium for the restoration of critical water supply and sewerage infrastructure in southern Turkey with EU funding

PLANET, a leading Greek consulting firm with significant and long-standing experience in project management and advisory services, has undertaken the technical assistance and supervision project for the restoration of critical water supply and sewerage infrastructure in the earthquake-affected provinces of Hatay and Osmaniye in Southeastern Turkey.

With a total budget of €5.1 million, the technical assistance project supports the restoration of water supply and sewerage infrastructure in two strategically important provinces of Southeastern Turkey, home to over 2.2 million inhabitants, which were severely impacted by the 2023 earthquakes.

As leader of the consortium – which also includes PLANET Turkey – PLANET will supervise and support the implementation of 4 wastewater treatment plants, 3 extensive water supply networks, 3 sewerage projects, as well as stormwater management systems and related infrastructure. In total, interventions include the construction of over 500 km of new water supply and sewerage networks, water storage tanks, and pumping stations, ensuring essential services for hundreds of thousands of residents.

Beyond the technical dimension, the project incorporates institutional strengthening actions, empowering municipal water and sewerage utilities and ensuring compliance with EU and Turkish environmental standards.

“The assignment highlights the trust of the Turkish Government and the European Commission in the consortium’s ability to deliver technically complex projects with long-term social and environmental impact,” said Dimitris Galanis, Partner & Director of PLANET’s International Business Unit. “We are honored to contribute to





a program of critical importance for the recovery and resilience of a region with a rich cultural heritage—where cities such as Antakya (Antioch) and İskenderun (Alexandretta) have left an indelible mark on Mediterranean civilization—and of particular significance for Greece. For us, the fact that this project is being implemented in Turkey carries added value, as it reaffirms PLANET’s enduring role as a bridge of cooperation and development across the wider region.”

The project will run for 36 months and is expected to become a reference point for international cooperation in post-disaster infrastructure restoration, combining technical excellence with strong environmental and social dimensions.
